Comparative and International Higher Education (CIHE): A Call for MENA Region-Focused Articles

CIHE is the official peer-reviewed journal of the Comparative and International Education Society (CIES) Higher Education Special Interest Group (HESIG), which was created in 2008. HESIG serves as a professional forum supporting development, analysis, and dissemination of theory-, policy- and practice-related issues that influence higher education across the globe. The journal is international and interdisciplinary with an emphasis on higher education. In addition to traditional articles, the journal is also a venue for critical essays, book and media reviews, and critical commentary. CIHE has an arrangement with University World News in which articles are cross-listed in each publication. The MENA region editors (Hana El-Ghali and Manar Sabry) of the CIES-HESIG journal, *Comparative and International Higher Education*, invite authors to submit manuscripts to be considered for publication in its 2017 -2018 issues (Fall: Submission deadline August 18th, 2017, Winter deadline December 1st, 2017, and Spring deadline March 1st, 2018).

You are invited to submit an editable, electronic version of an original manuscript in English that has not been published and is not under consideration elsewhere. All articles will undergo a peer-editing process. Submission may be in one of the three forms below.

- Regional Updates: Provides a general overview regarding current events or special interest issues in the MENA region or within a specific country. (1,000 words)
- Geographical Updates: A short geographical updates that highlight current events in MENA or in a specific field of higher education related to MENA region. (800 1200 words)
- Articles: Covers a variety of topics in higher education or a short informational piece about higher education in a MENA country. (2,000 3,800 words)

We also invite you to submit information about recent publications, conferences, and events about higher education in MENA.

CIHE follows The Chicago Manual of Style, 16th Edition (a link to The Chicago Manual of Style online website can be found at http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/contents.html). Specific reference examples can be found in published articles available at: http://higheredsig.org/publications/. Authors should pay particular attention to style details of headings/subheadings; citations and reference elements; use of acronyms; font type and size; and presentation of tables and figures. In addition, contributions must be introduced by a cover letter (email) addressed to the CIHE editors with the title of the manuscript, indicating that it is original, has not been published, and is not under consideration by another publication. It should include full name, institutional affiliation, and email of all authors.
